Achievements since last EuroBSDcon

Infrastructure changes:

- Documentation repo switch from CVS to SVN done by Hiroki Sato
 - brought support for branches for projects, translations, etc.
 - doc developers generally happy with it
 - (Literally) check it out: `svn+ssh://svn.freebsd.org/doc/head`
- Conversion from DocBook SGML to XML done by Gábor Kövesdán
 - big changes in the build infrastructure, source file renames to `.xml`
 - XSLT scripts for conversion to EPUB and other formats

Open issues from both conversions

We identified a few things after the conversions:

- To create nice looking PDFs would require a full blown Java now
 - we are hesitant to do that (too much overhead for just one format)
 - Do we really need all fancy features that it provides for our docs?
 - Alternatives were discussed, no definite solution found yet
- SVN revisions are now repo global, translators struggle with it
- Discussing creating UTF8-only docs as a next step
 - Input from Ed Schouten on status of UTF-8 support in the system

Handbook print edition

We want to create a new print edition of the handbook

- We have the proper infrastructure now with SVN and DocBook XML
- We could even sell eBooks with revenue going to the Foundation

Many open tasks remain:

- missing `indexterms`
- finding outdated sections that need rewrite or removal
- Updating content to cover 9.X releases
- Restructuring chapters
- Rewriting the preface
- Refreshing the glossary and acronyms
