# What is the FreeBSD Journal?

- Free bi-monthly Journal publication
- Has been around for 9 years
- Main topic is FreeBSD with changing issue topics, like
  - Software and System Management (January-February)
  - ARM64 is Tier 1 (March-April)
  - Disaster Recovery (May-June)
  - Science, Systems, and FreeBSD (July-August)
  - Performance (September-October)
  - Monitoring and Metrics (November-December)
- Content written entirely by the community
- Curated by editorial board
- Designed by ACM Queue magazine team
- Financed by advertisers in the magazine

## Why write for the Journal?

- No need to be a developer to contribute to the Journal
- Professional way of spreading the word about FreeBSD and its features
- Write about your FreeBSD passion as:
  - technical article
  - tutorial
  - side-bar
  - column
- Official publication (ISBN and all) to link to
- Beautiful designs done by the Journal team
- Low overhead process lets you focus on the writing features
- We'd love to have a handful of regular writers available providing content

# The Writing Process

- Editorial board member contacts you about a potential topic
- You agree to write
  - `format` plain-text, markdown, or Word processor
  - `timeframe` typically a month
  - `submission` via email to [jmaurer@freebsdjournal.com](mailto:jmaurer@freebsdjournal.com)
- Article gets designed and sent back to you for feedback
- Don't worry too much about your b0rken English or Yoda grammar...
- Review and make changes, corrections, additions
- When satisfied: final version gets published in next issue
